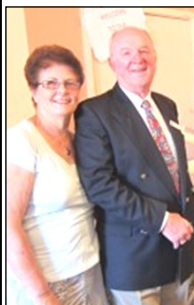

Tony will bring the outback to us in a meaningful way as he speaks about his time as a patrol minister and the ongoing work of Frontier Services. In 1912 the young Rev John Flynn had a vision to establish a "Mantle of

Safety" so people could build sustainable communities despite the hardships of outback life. Flynn's vision for outback people continues to be implemented today through Frontier Services. It is still the welcome visitor, the friend, the counsellor and advocate for the people of remote Australia.

The Forster Tuncurry Congregation is hosting a seminar on Saturday 4th August. Following the success of their initial "Discussion on Dementia" seminar last year, the Rev Frank Van Der Korput, has been invited to return to lead this year's seminar entitled "Caring". The focus will be on caring for those living with Dementia, and the Carers.
