Marriage decision up to the minister

The 15th Assembly of the Uniting Church in Australia has agreed to hold two equal and distinct views on marriage to reflect the diversity of Christian belief among its members.

Meeting for the first time since last year's change to Australian marriage laws, members of the Church's national decision-making body, the Assembly, resolved to allow its ministers the freedom to conduct or to refuse to conduct same-gender marriages. "This decision follows many years of reflection, prayer and discernment, and I want to thank Assembly members for the way they have responded with grace to what is a difficult conversation for many people of faith," said Uniting Church President Dr Deidre Palmer.

Dr Palmer acknowledged the ministry and struggle of LGBTIQ people in the Uniting Church over many years. "I know that this conversation is painful and difficult for you," said Dr Palmer, directly addressing LGBTIQ Church members.

"We also acknowledge those who for whatever reason have not been able to support this change – and your pain and difficulty in this space."

"Please rest assured that your rights to follow your beliefs on marriage will be respected and protected."

A warm welcome is extended to everyone worshipping at our Church today.

Set in an area of natural beauty and adjacent to the beach

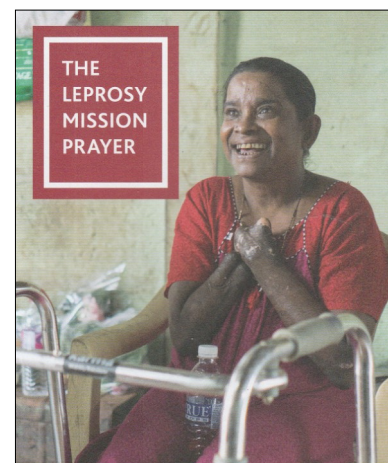
